

The 2-Topic Approach

Most four-day MUN conferences use a two-topic approach, meaning they dedicate time to discussing two different issues. This strategy is designed to keep delegates engaged and prevent discussion from getting stale.

Instead of spending the entire conference on one subject, you'll shift gears halfway through and start with something else. Often with new blocs forming and different dynamics emerging.

1. Early Committee Sessions are Key

The two-topic approach means that early sessions are important. During the first 2 committee sessions you will want to know which delegates you will be drafting your resolution with.

2. Prioritize The First Topic

Delays are a natural part of any MUN conference, so the second topic often gets less discussion time. If you have a strong preference for one of the topics, it can be smart to campaign for it before the official debate starts on Day 1. You can do this by arriving to committee early and discussing the agenda with other delegates.
